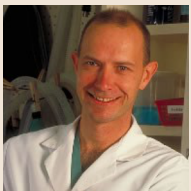

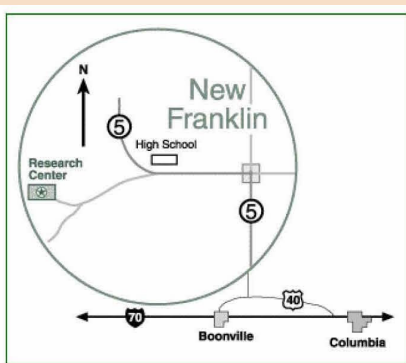

From Columbia: Go west on Interstate 70 to the 121 exit at Fayette / Hwy. 40. Exit right onto Hwy. 40. Stay on Hwy. 40 until you see New Franklin. Take Hwy. 5 into New Franklin about 1 mile to the 4 way stop.

From Boonville: Exit Interstate 70 at the Boonville exit 101 for Hwy. 5 and take Hwy. 5 through Boonville. Cross over the Missouri River Bridge, and look for New Franklin. Continue on Hwy. 5 into New Franklin about 1 mile to the 4 way stop.

Once you get to the 4 way stop in New Franklin, turn left onto Broadway and go about 1/2 mile. Look for the New Franklin High School on the right and a car wash on the left. Turn left in front of the car wash to continue driving on Broadway. Proceed down the hill on Broadway about 1/2 mile until you see the "MU Horticulture and Agroforestry Research Center" sign on the right.
