International Curriculum Project: Learning Program on Food Security in the Eurasian Region

As part of a large University of Missouri effort, a number of MU faculty are involved in developing courses in a Food Security Master's project for the World Bank. The project is focused on curricular development for two Master's degree programs for the faculty at Moscow State University (Russia), one in AgroFood Management and a second on Land and Water Resource Management. The overall project goals are: 1) Building the knowledge and skills needed to critically examine and formulate sustainable, innovative solutions to problems that impact food security and land and water resource management throughout the Eurasian Region; and 2) To promote the development of a network of professionals throughout the Region.

Students enrolled in the "Land and Water Resources Management for Food Security" MS program will acquire

knowledge, skills and abilities required for development and making management decisions in the field of agriculture, environment and food security. The program is being designed to provide students with fundamental knowledge in

the field of environment and nature management, land and water resource management, agriculture and also to develop professional knowledge and competencies in the field of food security and rational use of natural resources. Center faculty are involved in a number of the courses and include Dr. Jose (Ecological Principles of Natural Resources and Agroecosystem Management) and Dr. Iose and Dr. Udawatta (Fundamentals of Land Resource Management for Food Security), Dr. Lin [with Dr. Lupo] (Climate Change, Land Degradation and Desertification and Implications for Food Security), and Dr. Gold [with Dr. Hendrickson] (Sustainable Agriculture and Development).
