Upcoming "Agroforestry in Action Webinar" Features Savanna Institute

Speaker Keefe Keeley will present "Participatory Research & Outreach in Savanna-Mimicking Agroecosystems" on March 30 at 11 a.m. (CST).

Keeley will discuss the work of the Savanna Institute and their efforts to develop and promote "Savanna-based Restoration Agriculture Systems." Savannabased Restoration Agriculture mimics the structure and function of the Midwestern oak savanna to sustainably produce

an agricultural yield while simultaneously restoring ecosystem services. Typical species in this system include a variety of nut trees (e.g., chestnut and hazelnut), a variety of fruits and berries (e.g., apple, grape, and raspberry), and grazing animals (e.g., cattle, hogs, and chickens).

The Midwestern oak savanna was the dominant pre-plow ecosystem of the Midwestern

understory sparse with shrubs, and a ground layer rich in grasses and forbs. Regular disturbance via fire and large grazing animals keep the savanna ecosystem halted midsuccession in its diverse and productive multi-layer nature.

Restoration Agriculture is the intentional restoration of healthy, functional ecosystems as the context for economically viable

farm operations. Perennial crops, livestock, fungus, and pollinators are integrated to produce abundant food, fiber, and fuel and simultaneously restore critical ecosystem

> services such as carbon sequestration, water purification and infiltration, nutrient cycling, and biodiversity.

Rather than perpetuating the separation of nature and humans, this system attempts to break down the dichotomy between ecological restoration

and agriculture. This concept has grown and evolved out of fields such as agroecology, agroforestry, permaculture, silvopasture, carbon farming, and ecological restoration, but the application of this paradigm to large-scale industrial agriculture is a relatively new idea.
